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Dear Parents / Guardians,

MESSAGE BY PRINCIPAL FOR START OF TERM 4 2024

At the end of Term 3, Team Yuhua gave the school much to celebrate. Our C Division Football boys emerged as Champions of League 4, while our C Division Volleyball girls emerged as Champions of League 2. Mdm Irfana (from Science Department, Form Teacher of 3 Responsibility) was also one of 15 teachers nationwide recognized with the Listening Educator for Advancement and Progress (LEAP) Award. In a year where we rally to the theme of 'Braving the Future: Courage to Care, Connect, Contribute', I am heartened by the growing spirit of excellence, as staff and students continue to bear courage with care-connect-contribute towards growth and achievement.

As we continue to aim high for all Yuhuans, it is my firm belief that the potential of our Yuhuans is only hindered by distractions and interferences that exists. A growing challenge we are all aware – is the **concerning impact of screentime, gaming and social media on the holistic well-being of our young ones**. This has been profiled with great detail in our local media, and I have also spoken to our students at the end of Term 3. See the appended attachment for the deck of slides I shared with students for your reference.

Studies have shown that a large proportion of youths in Singapore and the world has problematic smartphone use. This has led to negative impacts on their cognitive, socio-emotional as well as holistic well-being. Data in our school also show that more than 50% of our students are spending more than 4 hours a day on screens for entertainment purposes – this is not including the use of Personal Learning Devices (PLDs) for schoolwork.

The dangers and risks are clear, and school wishes to continue in our strong partnership with parents / guardians to educate students on responsible device use. In recent weeks, you would have learnt about the issues with Mobile Guardian and iPads. We have notified parents / guardians over Parent's Gateway on parental controls that we strongly recommend for all families to implement. We continue to urge parents / guardians to have firm rules and parental controls on device usage for your children at home. To prepare for Term 4, we have also communicated with students clearly on our school rules:

1. PLDs should **NOT** have any games or social media apps installed.
2. Personal mobile phones must be in personal lockers **at all times**, and not to be used unless teacher permission is given.

We hope that the above reminders and guidelines helps our students understand the dangers with excessive screen time, and to be better able to focus on schoolwork and relationship-building in school with self-directedness and ownership. Term 4 marks the season for exams, and we urge the overall school community to have the **courage to care-connect-contribute together to achieve excellence**.

1 Nurturing Flourishing Yuhuans Through Student Development

1.1 Values of the Term – Adaptability and Resilience

As we begin the final term of the academic year, we encourage students to be **adaptable** and seize opportunities to enhance their learning. This includes making effective use of the extra time available due to the stand-down of CCAs to reassess their study strategies for potential improvements. Additionally, students should demonstrate **resilience** by facing challenges and keeping up their efforts to end the year strong, both academically and in their overall development. We kindly ask for your support in reinforcing the values of adaptability and resilience with your child during this important period.

1.2 Being Prepared for Learning

Please continue to remind your child/ward to be punctual for school. Students should plan their journey well and be in school by 7.25 a.m. on all days, except for Wednesdays when they should reach by 8.25 a.m. This will allow them to be in school 5 minutes before assembly, therefore reaching their reporting venues (e.g. hall or classrooms) in time to prepare well for their learning.

We also seek your support to monitor your child's/ward's attendance closely, and ensure he/she does not stay away from school without valid reason. This will ensure students do not miss lessons unnecessarily in the run up to the End-of-Year Exams.

1.3 Graduating Students

a) The *Final Sprint* revision programme

The Final Sprint revision programme will continue in Term 4, where different teachers will be available for students to consult with in the school library from 3.15 p.m to 6.15 p.m daily. Students are highly encouraged to make full use of this time to prepare for their examinations by clarifying their doubts with teachers.

b) Graduation Ceremony

The Graduation Ceremony for Sec 4/5 students will be held on **20 September (Friday)**. This is a significant milestone for our graduating cohort, as we spur them on in this last lap in a ceremony with full graduation gowns and a special farewell from school. We would like to take this opportunity to invite parents/guardians of graduating students to join your child/ward in celebrating this milestone. Please refer to the letter sent to parents/guardians of graduating students on 16 August for more information.

c) Intensive Study Week for All Graduating Students

Following the graduation ceremony, the school will be implementing an intensive study week from **23 – 27 September** for all graduating students. This is to provide graduating students with customized support to make necessary preparations. Students should report to school as per normal for the intensive study week.

d) Study Break for Students Taking GCE 'O' Levels

Students taking GCE 'O' Levels will be given a study break from **30 September**. This is to provide them with white space to make personal preparations for their upcoming examinations, while different groups of students sit for their respective science practical exams on different dates. During the study break, students can continue to contact their teachers to schedule for consultations. They are also free to use the school facilities (e.g. library) to study and revise should it be more conducive.

2.2 School Examinations, Marking Day and Exam Admin Day

Besides our graduating students, we also encourage all Sec 1 – 3 students to work hard in preparation for their **End-of-Year Examinations taking place from 27 September to 8 October**. The exam timetable will be sent out to all students shortly next week.

In light of the upcoming examinations, CCAs for Sec 1 – 3s have stood down. Students should focus on revision, and resume CCA activities only after their exams are over.

Please note that **9 – 10 October** are Marking Days and **18 October** is Exam Admin Day. **Students need not report to school**, and a further reminder will be sent via PG nearer the date.

2.3 Early Dismissal for Sec 1 – 3s during Post Examination Period

Following the End-of-Year Examinations, **Sec 1 – 3 students will transit to a post exam timetable with an earlier dismissal time of 12.40 p.m.** This is to facilitate the checking of scripts, conduct of post exam activities and the commencement of GCE 'O' Level written exam papers in the afternoons. 2.4 iAspire (Bridging) Programme for Students Who Fail to Meet Promotion Criteria

Lessons will be carried out to strengthen understanding in the core subjects, and the identified students will be assessed at the end of the programme on their eligibility for advancement to the next level.
